

Pastor Gregory A. Johnson, Hon DMe

Pastor Gregory Johnson is the founding pastor of the Church of Love located in Long Beach, California. Pastor Johnson is responsible for the continued oversight and development of fellowship churches and ministries particularly addressing the homelessness, and health care needs of the congregation and surrounding communities that it serves. In 2005, Pastor Johnson was ordained as minister leading the development/creation of formation and ministries including New Directions Christian Fellowship Church, and Los Angeles Denomination Diabetes Education and Research (LADDER) – a coalition of churches within the Los Angeles and Long Beach areas. Pastor Johnson designed and created outreach

initiatives with other churches in developing health care policies focusing on the community health care needs impacting minority populations.

Pastor Johnson earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Biblical Studies from Indiana Wesleyan University, and a Master of Science degree in Health Administration from St. Luke School of Medicine in Liberia. His Liberal Arts degree was earned at University of Maryland in Baltimore.

As co-founder of American University of Health Sciences, a faith-based educational institution, he's a leader's "leader" devoting himself to the betterment of man through the spiritual and educational processes. Pastor Johnson held the Chief Operating Officer position of AUHS and is a member of the Board of Trustees. His management training, earned from Dale Carnegie, has been demonstrated in his leadership in developing and establishing churches and ministries focused in serving the poor through his faith in God.



Kim Dang-Johnson, Hon DMe

Dr. Dang is the owner & founder of American University of Health Sciences (AUHS) in 1994, formerly known as American Institute of Health Sciences. She served as the CEO/President from 1994 to 2010. Dr. Dang developed, managed, and established AUHS operational processes in the areas of student services, registrar, admissions, financial aid, career services, institution publications, and finance. Under her leadership, AUHS obtained ABHES national accreditation in 1997, degree granting institution status from BPPE in 2001, ACICS national accreditation in 2003, Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) 2006, and CCNE programmatic nursing accreditation in 2011.

In 1990, Dr. Dang served as Executive Director for the non-profit Society for Educational and Economic Development S.E.E.D. collaborating with public schools in the City of Santa Ana to create pathways for inner city High School youths to complete their education thru after school program in the Arts and Entrepreneurship. Dr. Dang established the "Underground Art Gallery" at S.E.E.D. in the historic Santora Building in the heart of Santa Ana as a safe afterschool haven to work, display, and promote the sale of art work created by the inner-city youths. Dr. Dang established a network of donors to develop scholarships for inner-city youth to assist them with their pursuit of higher education.

In 2002, Dr. Dang was given an Honorary Doctorate in Medical Education by St. Luke School of Medicine in Liberia. In 2016, Dr. Dang was honored with Humanitarian Award by the Council of Black Nurses for her many works with the underserved communities in the U.S. and abroad.

In 2014-2015, Dr. Dang collaborated with CHIPAA in the development of "Health in the Park", a free health fair promoting health and wellness initiatives dealing with healthcare disparities in the Cambodian community. Dr. Dang is the Founder and President of AUHS Foundation.

Betty Smith Williams DrPH, MSN 2025 Commencement Keynote Speaker

Founding Dean, AUHS School of Nursing | Nurse Educator | National Advocate for Health Equity | Co-Founder, National Black Nurses Association | Living Legend Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (FAAN)

Dr. Williams' legacy is deeply woven into the history of American University of Health Sciences, where she served as the Founding Dean of the School of Nursing, Bachelor of Science in Nursing in 2006. She continues to serve as a dedicated member of the AUHS Board of Trustees, inspiring new generations of nurses and healthcare professionals with her vision, grace, and unwavering commitment to excellence.

She holds a Doctor of Public Health and Master of Science in Nursing from UCLA, an M.N. from Case Western Reserve University, and a Bachelor of Science in Zoology from Howard University. She is widely recognized for her service, including being named among Ebony magazine's "100+ Most Influential Organization Leaders."

A lifelong champion of equity and access, Dr. Williams made history in 1956 as the first African American to teach at a college or university level in California, beginning her faculty appointment at Mount Saint Mary's College, School of Nursing. Her academic career has since spanned more than five decades, with influential roles as professor and assistant dean at esteemed institutions such as UCLA, Cal State Long Beach, and the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. She holds the title of Professor Emeritus and remains a nationally respected voice in healthcare education and leadership.

Dr. Williams is a proud co-founder of the National Black Nurses Association (NBNA), established in 1971 to give African American nurses a collective voice and an active role in shaping the future of the profession. She later served as 7th NBNA President and continues her national advocacy as President Emeritus of the National Coalition of Ethnic Minority Nurse Associations. In recognition of her contributions, she was inducted as a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (FAAN) in 1980 and became a living legend in FAAN in 2010.

Her influence extends far beyond the classroom. Dr. Williams has been a leader in philanthropy and civic service, holding leadership roles within Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., chairing corporate boards including Blue Cross of California, and shaping national health policy through organizations such as the **Black Congress on Health, Law, and Economics.**

A trailblazer and tireless advocate, Dr. Williams has paved the way for countless nurses and healthcare providers, scholars, and leaders. Her life's work stands as a testament to the transformative power of **education**, **leadership**, **and compassion**.

Dr. Betty Smith Williams is a remarkable example of a Black nurse who made significant contributions to nursing, healthcare, and public health—paving the way for future generations. That's what it means to be a **legendary woman**.


